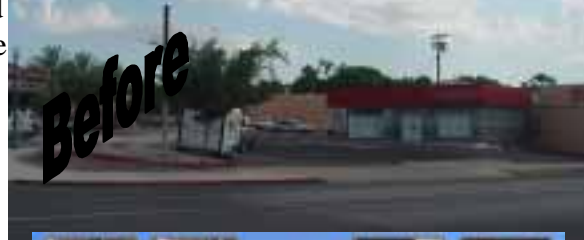
Wilbur Square this year and will be hosting a huge book sale.

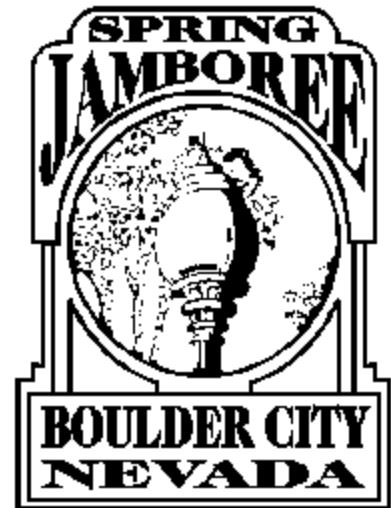

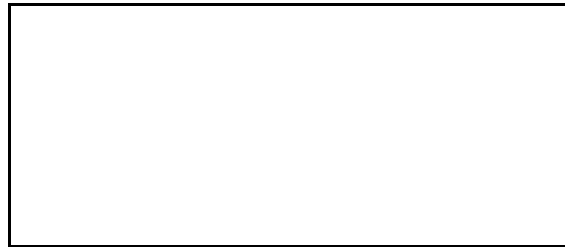
